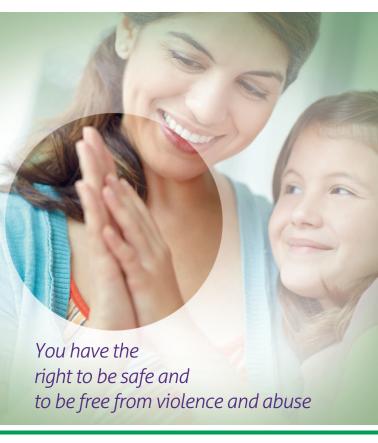

What is family violence?

- · Physical or sexual abuse
- Emotional or psychological abuse
- · Economic abuse like with-holding money or family resources
- · Threats or coercion
- Isolating you from family & friends
- · Harming things you love such as pets, personal belongings
- Controlling or dominating you, causing you to fear for your safety or the wellbeing of another person
- Causing your child to hear, witness, or otherwise be exposed to the effects of violence

Family violence:

- Is mainly committed by men against women, children and other vulnerable people including the elderly
- Can happen to anyone
- Affects children and can impact their physical, psychological and emotional well-being
- Affects the entire community regardless of location, socioeconomic and health status, age, culture, sexual identity, ability, ethnicity or religion
- Is more damaging to the health of women 15 45 than any other well known risk factors



safe steps can assist you:

- · To make decisions for a safer future
- With emergency accommodation or refuge
- In finding new and safe accommodation
- With information about your rights, entitlements $\boldsymbol{\varepsilon}$ options
- To leave your home (even temporarily) until the abuser can be held to account
- To stay safe in your own home, with your children while the abuser is required by law to leave
- Through advocacy with other support services, the police and criminal justice systems
- By putting you in touch with local support agencies state-wide
- With telephone support & information for non-offending family members and friends
